Summary of main barriers to learning for children eligible for Pupil Premium:

- Under-developed reading, spelling and numeracy skills of some of our disadvantaged pupils.
- Low self-esteem and related social skills in identified pupils.
- Financial difficulties of disadvantaged families.
- Narrow range of vocabularly.

For the year 2018-2019, Burley Gate C E Primary School has received an allocation of £14,100 for children who attract Pupil Premium Funding. This has been allocated as follows:
