Warm up:

Following on from last the learning about syllables last week - can your child clap the syllables in the following words:

visit
jacket
cobweb
zigzag
carpet

Now see if your child can write the words from the list above, splitting the word into syllables and then sounding each out slowly as they write.

Play the Yes/No game.

Read the questions on the screen together - can the child answer yes or no?

(This activity helps children to read for meaning - are they absorbing the information or just focusing on the letters and sounds?)

Tuesday

Warm up: Sing the alphabet song or look at an alphabet chart and say the names of all the letters of the alphabet. Practise all the graphemes (letters) learnt so far.

Read a sentence about the town together:
e.g. I can run to the park.

Go through each of the sentences, reading them together, encouraging your child to spot tricky words and sound out words independently. Once all of the words have been de-coded, can your child re-read the sentence with increasing fluency, remembering the words?

Ask your child to choose a sentence and draw a picture to go with it. Alternatively, you can print off the document for your child to draw a picture for each sentence.

Can your child think of 3 different phrases/questions/sentences using the word 'are'?



Play 'Buried Treasure' using Phonics Play or make coins using the following words:
chain, shook, powder, march, hasrsh, thain, chook, nowder, farch, barsh

Look at the three pictures of the different town scenes; choose one to write labels for items that your child can see (e.g. bus, road, park, swing, church, shop).

Can your child build a town using Lego, Duplo or Play Mobil and write a caption for the town scene?



Friday

Warm up: Sing the alphabet song or look at an alphabet chart and say the names of all the letters of the alphabet.

Today, we are beginning to learn about CVCC words! So far, we have concentrated on VC (Vowel Consonant e.g. 'on') and CVC (Consonant Vowel Consonant e.g. 'cat' or 'rain'). Now we are moving onto words with adjacent consonants, initially at the end of the word - Consonant Vowel Consonant Consonant e.g. hand.

To begin with, write the word 'ten' on a piece of paper (or a whiteboard/ chalkboard if you have one). Ask your child to sound out and blend the word. Now add a 't' to the end of the word and sound out again - what word have you made?

You could try this again with 'hum' - add a 'p' to the end; han - add a 'd'.

You could then read these captions:

Help! I got a bump on the leg.

A tent will get damp in the rain.

Milk is good for teeth and gums.

If you would like to practise some more CVCC words, you could play 'Buried Treasure' on Phonics play, but now you need to select Phase 4!
